



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

The Ministry will then determine whether the Crown has a duty to consult. Information and resources to assist the City of Sarnia and Golder Associates Ltd in fulfilling this requirement are provided as an attachment.

ABORIGINAL CONSULTATION INFORMATION

Consultation with Interested Persons under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act

Proponents subject to the Ontario *Environmental Assessment Act* are required to consult with interested persons, which may include First Nations and Métis communities. In some cases, special efforts may be required to ensure that Aboriginal communities are made aware of the project and are afforded opportunities to provide comments. Direction about how to consult with interested persons/communities is provided in the Code of Practice: Consultation in Ontario's Environmental Assessment Process available on the Ministry's website:

As an early part of the consultation process, proponents are required to contact the Ontario Ministry of Aboriginal Affairs' Consultation Unit and visit Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada's Aboriginal and Treaty Rights Information System (ATRIS) to help identify which First Nation and Métis communities may be interested in or potentially impacted by their proposed projects.

You are advised to provide notification directly to all of the First Nation and Métis communities who may be interested in the project. You should contact First Nation communities through their Chief and Band Council, and Metis communities through their elected leadership.

Rights-based consultation with First Nation and Métis Communities

Proponents should note that, in addition to requiring interest-based consultation as described above, certain projects may have the potential to adversely affect the ability of First Nation or Métis communities to exercise their established or credibly asserted Aboriginal or treaty rights. In such cases, Ontario may have a duty to consult those Aboriginal communities.

Activities which may restrict or reduce access to unoccupied Crown lands, or which could result in a potential adverse impact to land or water resources in which harvesting rights are exercised, may have the potential to impact Aboriginal or treaty rights. For assistance in determining whether your proposed project could affect these rights, please refer to the attached "Preliminary Assessment Checklist: First Nation and Métis Community Interest."

If there is likely to be an adverse impact to Aboriginal or treaty rights, accommodation may be required to avoid or minimize the adverse impacts. Accommodation is an outcome of consultation and includes any mechanism used to avoid or minimize adverse impacts to Aboriginal or treaty rights and traditional uses. Solutions could include mitigation such as v.1.1.4.0

adjustments in the timing or geographic location of the proposed activity. Accommodation may in certain circumstances involve the provision of financial compensation, but does not necessarily require it.

Delegation of Procedural Aspects of Consultation

Proponents have an important and direct role in the consultation process, including a responsibility to conduct adequate consultation with First Nation and Métis communities as part of the environmental assessment process. This is laid out in existing environmental assessment codes of practice and guides that can be accessed from the Ministry's environmental assessment website at

www.ontario.ca/environmentalassessments

The Ministry relies on consultation conducted by proponents when it assesses the Crown's obligations and directs proponents during the regulatory process. Where the Crown's duty to consult is triggered, various additional procedural steps may also be asked of proponents as part of their delegated duty to consult responsibilities. In some situations, the Crown may also become involved in consultation activities.

Ontario will have an oversight role as the consultation process unfolds but will be relying on the steps undertaken and information you obtain to ensure adequate consultation has taken place. To ensure that First Nation and Métis communities have the ability to assess a project's potential to adversely affect their Aboriginal or treaty rights, Ontario requires proponents to undertake certain procedural aspects of consultation.

The proponent's responsibilities for procedural aspects of consultation include:

• Providing notice to the elected leadership of the First Nation and/or Métis communities (e.g., First Nation Chief) as early as possible regarding the project;

- Providing First Nation and/or Métis communities with information about the proposed project including anticipated impacts, information on timelines and your environmental assessment process;
- Following up with First Nation and/or Métis communities to ensure they received project information and that they are aware of the opportunity to express comments and concerns about the project. If you are unable to make the appropriate contacts (e.g. are unable to contact the Chief) please contact the Environmental Assessment and Planning Coordinator at the Ministry's appropriate regional office for further direction.
- Providing First Nation and/or Métis communities with opportunities to meet with appropriate proponent representatives to discuss the project;
- Gathering information about how the project may adversely impact the relevant Aboriginal and/or Treaty rights (for example, hunting, fishing) or sites of cultural significance (for example, burial grounds, archaeological sites);
- Considering the comments and concerns provided by First Nation and/or Métis communities and providing responses;
- Where appropriate, discussing potential mitigation strategies with First Nation and/or Métis communities;
- Bearing the reasonable costs associated with these procedural aspects of consultation, which may include providing support to help build communities' capacity to participate in consultation about the proposed project.
- Maintaining a Consultation Record to show evidence that you, the proponent, completed all the steps itemized above or at a minimum made meaningful attempts to do so.
- Upon request, providing copies of the Consultation Record to the Ministry. The Consultation Record should:
 - summarize the nature of any comments and questions received from First Nation and/or Métis communities
 - o describe your response to those comments and how their concerns were considered
 - o include a communications log indicating the dates and times of all communications; and
 - o document activities in relation to consultation.

Successful consultation depends, in part, on early engagement by proponents with First Nation and Métis communities. Information shared with communities must be clear, accurate and complete, and in plain language where possible. The consultation process must maintain sufficient flexibility to respond to new information, and we trust you will make all reasonable efforts to build positive relationships with all First Nation and Métis communities contacted. If you need more specific guidance on Aboriginal consultation steps in relation to your proposed project, or if you feel consultation has reached an impasse, please contact the Environmental Assessment and Planning Coordinator at the Ministry's appropriate regional office.

Preliminary Assessment Checklist: First Nation and Métis Community Interests and Rights

In addition to other interests, some main concerns of First Nation and Métis communities may pertain to established or asserted rights to hunt, gather, trap, and fish – these activities generally occur on Crown land or water bodies. 

Technical Memo: Aylmer District Species at Risk Screening Process

The intent of this technical memo is to clarify the process for engaging the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (**MNRF**) Aylmer District Office regarding the *Endangered Species Act, 2007* (**ESA**). Please refer to page 2 for MNRF Aylmer District staff contact information.

The ESA came into force on June 30, 2008, and provides both species protection (Section 9) and habitat protection (Section 10) to species listed as Endangered or Threatened on the Species at Risk in Ontario List (<u>http://www.e-laws.gov.on.ca/html/regs/english/elaws regs 080230 e.htm</u>). MNRF Aylmer District provides the service of responding to species at risk (**SAR**) information requests (Stage 1) and project screening requests (Stage 2) when:

- 1. The request comes from the property owner or consultants on their behalf; and,
- 2. A specific project/activity is proposed.

Stage 1: Information Request

MNRF encourages landowners/their consultants proposing to conduct site alteration on their property to request SAR information from the district prior to beginning the project. For MNRF to respond to an information request, the following information is required:

- Proponent information (i.e. name, mailing address, and email address);
- Detailed property location information (maps are beneficial);
- Digital photos of the property, including the vegetation on-site, if available;
- General description of all proposed activities and extent of development footprint (e.g. residential, driveway, vegetation clearing);
- Current state of vegetation and history of property maintenance (e.g. mowing regime);
- Timing and duration of proposed activities;
- Copies of past correspondence with MNRF about the property, if applicable; and,
- Type and status of municipal planning or Environmental Assessment process, if any.

Once the above information has been provided, MNRF will review SAR data on file to determine if SAR individuals and their habitat(s) are known or likely to occur on or in the general area of the requested property. MNRF's response will be one of the following:

- 1. <u>There is a high likelihood for SAR species and/or habitat to occur</u>: MNRF may recommend that a qualified biologist be retained to complete field assessments on site.
 - MNRF will expect the qualified biologist to use the information provided in the information request response to scope and design the field assessments, including identifying appropriate survey methodologies and timing windows.
 - MNRF is available to provide guidance on field assessments (i.e. review of proposed work plans). Some field assessment methodologies may require MNRF authorizations under the ESA and the *Fish and Wildlife Conservation Act*.
 - After field assessments have been completed, proceed to Stage 2: project screening request.

- <u>There is a low likelihood for SAR species and/or habitat to occur and/or be impacted</u>: A letter to proponent (LOA) can be provided, if requested. The LOA may include recommendations to avoid impacts to SAR.
 - A Stage 2: project screening request will not be needed.

Stage 2: Project Screening

After MNRF responds to the information request and appropriate field assessments have been completed by a qualified biologist, a project screening request can be submitted to MNRF. For MNRF to respond to a project screening request, the following information should be provided using the Information Gathering Form available at the following website link:

(http://www.forms.ssb.gov.on.ca/mbs/ssb/forms/ssbforms.nsf/MinistryResults?Openform&SRT=T&MAX=5&ENV=W WE&STR=1&TAB=PROFILE&MIN=018&BRN=21&PRG=31):

- Name and qualifications of the biologist;
- Dates and weather conditions of field assessment days;
- Survey methodologies and survey times, frequencies and durations;
- Maps and coordinates of locations of observed SAR individuals and/or habitat features;
- Detailed description of all proposed activities and extent of development footprint (e.g. driveway, septic, vegetation clearing); and,
- Analysis of results from field work including size and quality of SAR habitat area that could be impacted based on proposed project footprint area.

MNRF will use the above information to determine the likelihood that the project may contravene either Section 9 (impacts to protected individuals) or Section 10 (impacts to protected habitat) of the ESA. MNRF's response will be one of the following:

- 1. <u>Contravention under the ESA is **not likely** to occur</u>: A LOA can be provided, if requested. The LOA may include recommendations to avoid impacts to SAR; or,
- <u>Contravention under the ESA is **likely** to occur</u>: MNRF will initiate discussions regarding the permit process or alternative regulatory processes. Please be advised that applying for a permit does not guarantee approval and processes can take several months before a permit may be issued.





The Ministry will then determine whether the Crown has a duty to consult.

You are advised to provide notification directly to all of the First Nation and Métis communities who may be interested in the project. You should contact First Nation communities through their Chief and Band Council, and Metis communities through their elected leadership.

Rights-based consultation with First Nation and Métis Communities

Proponents should note that, in addition to requiring interest-based consultation as described above, certain projects may have the potential to adversely affect the ability of First Nation or Métis communities to exercise their established or credibly asserted Aboriginal or treaty rights. In such cases, Ontario may have a duty to consult those Aboriginal communities.

Activities which may restrict or reduce access to unoccupied Crown lands, or which could result in a potential adverse impact to land or water resources in which harvesting rights are exercised, may have the potential to impact Aboriginal or treaty rights. For assistance in determining whether your proposed project could affect these rights, please refer to the attached "Preliminary Assessment Checklist: First Nation and Métis Community Interest."

If there is likely to be an adverse impact to Aboriginal or treaty rights, accommodation may be required to avoid or minimize the adverse impacts. Delegation of Procedural Aspects of Consultation

Proponents have an important and direct role in the consultation process, including a responsibility to conduct adequate consultation with First Nation and Métis communities as part of the environmental assessment process. This is laid out in existing environmental assessment codes of practice and guides that can be accessed from the Ministry's environmental assessment website at

The Ministry relies on consultation conducted by proponents when it assesses the Crown's obligations and directs proponents during the regulatory process. - Providing First Nation and/or Métis communities with opportunities to meet with appropriate proponent representatives to discuss the project;
- Gathering information about how the project may adversely impact the relevant Aboriginal and/or Treaty rights (for example, hunting, fishing) or sites of cultural significance (for example, burial grounds, archaeological sites);
- Considering the comments and concerns provided by First Nation and/or Métis communities and providing responses;
- Where appropriate, discussing potential mitigation strategies with First Nation and/or Métis communities;
- Bearing the reasonable costs associated with these procedural aspects of consultation, which
 may include providing support to help build communities' capacity to participate in
 consultation about the proposed project.
- Maintaining a Consultation Record to show evidence that you, the proponent, completed all the steps itemized above or at a minimum made meaningful attempts to do so.
- Upon request, providing copies of the Consultation Record to the Ministry. The Consultation Record should:
 - summarize the nature of any comments and questions received from First Nation and/or Métis communities
 - o describe your response to those comments and how their concerns were considered
 - o include a communications log indicating the dates and times of all communications; and
 - o document activities in relation to consultation.

Successful consultation depends, in part, on early engagement by proponents with First Nation and Métis communities. Information shared with communities must be clear, accurate and complete, and in plain language where possible. The consultation process must maintain sufficient flexibility to respond to new information, and we trust you will make all reasonable efforts to build positive relationships with all First Nation and Métis communities contacted. If you need more specific guidance on Aboriginal consultation steps in relation to your proposed project, or if you feel consultation has reached an impasse, please contact the Environmental Assessment and Planning Coordinator at the Ministry's appropriate regional office.

It was great seeing you last week to conduct the site visit with the St. Clair Region Conservation Authority. As discussed at the end of the meeting, can you please provide the following information:

- confirmation of when the updated Official Plan will be available; A new Sarnia Official Plan was
 adopted by City Council on June 30, 2014. The Plan was approved by the County of Lambton in
 February, 2015. The Plan is under appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board. It will not come into
 effect until after the Board considers the appeal. The Adopted Official Plan is available on the
 City's website at this link http://www.sarnia.ca/doing-business/planning-and-propertydevelopment/adopted-official-plan
- a copy of the City's Waterfront Master Plan; PDF of Waterfront Master Plan is attached.
- construction date of the boat launch, if available; and ? unknown. The Marina was built in the early to mid-1980s. (the civic address of 97 Seaway Road was assigned in about 1983).
- communications from the City's heritage planners on whether the boat launch or other structures within the study area are considered heritage resources by the City. The City's heritage planner is on vacation until July 28, 2015. You could contact Max Williams when he returns to confirm the status of the boat launch and other heritage buildings/structures. As far as I know, the boat launch is not a heritage structure; the monuments in the Park would be of heritage value.

Good Afternoon Jessalyn:

I am writing to you today in response to your immediately preceding e-mail of July 7th, 2015. I apologize for my delay in responding due in part to my desire to receive internal input / advice on your query from some of my MOECC Regional EA

Co-ordinator counterparts, in other MOECC offices across the Province, and a week of a absence from the office due to a recent summer vacation.

As advertised through the attached Notice of Commencement, the City of Sarnia initiated a Municipal Class EA to investigate options for shoreline protection along the southern waterfront of Sarnia Bay in Centennial Park (the Park). According to the Notice of Commencement, <u>the EA would</u> <u>also evaluate the removal of an existing boat ramp and installation of a new one closer to the</u> <u>existing marina</u>. The purpose of the study to develop a recommended plan to provide shoreline protection that is necessary for implementation of a clean soil cap at the Park in order to address historical contaminants in fill that was used during Park construction.

As noted in your preceding e-mail, under the Municipal Class EA process, there is a requirement to complete a Schedule 'C' level assessment when municipal plans: include the construction of new shore line works, such as off-shore breakwaters, shore-connected breakwaters, groynes and sea walls (MEA, 2001, Page 1-19, No. 9). You have questioned this ministry as to whether the construction of a new boat launch within the project study area is subject to the Municipal Engineers Association Municipal Class EA, and if alternative designs of the boat launch are to be considered in addition to alternatives to protect the shoreline.

The MOECC acknowledges that boat launches are not specifically listed under Point No. 9 of Schedule C Wastewater Projects of the Municipal Engineers Association Municipal Class EA. However, that said, MOECC suggests that the shoreline works that are listed within Schedule C, are not the only shoreline works that could conceivably be part of a Schedule C Class EA. Reason being, Point No. 9's choice of terminology "such as" insinuates in and of itself that other shoreline works could conceivably be added and not limited just to those shoreline works specifically currently listed in Schedule C of the MEA Municipal Class EA.

Also, the City of Sarnia's Notice of Commencement specifically stated to the public, First Nations, and review agencies that this Class EA would in fact evaluate the removal of the existing boat ramp and installation of a new one closer to the existing marina. The general public, First Nations, and review agencies now have an expectation, based upon the project description outlined in the City's Notice of Commencement, that these aspects of the project will be fully reviewed and alternatives considered, culminating in a preferred alternative, including the right if need be to submit a Part II Order to the Minister of the Environment & Climate Change. For the City to do otherwise now, may

invite criticism from one or more of the foregoing sources, and also could in and of itself result in Part Ii Order requests being submitted to the Minister for this project that might not otherwise have been submitted if the Class EA was completed as originally described in the Notice of Commencement.

In short, this Class EA should proceed as originally stated in the City's Notice of Commencement, providing the public, First Nations, and review agencies the opportunity to comment on the whole project including but not limited to both the removal of the existing boat ramp and the installation of a new one closer to the existing marina, and the right to submit Part II Order request(s) to the Minister of Environment & Climate Change should such be deemed necessary.

As a member of the government review team, the Ministry of Aboriginal Affairs (MAA) identifies First Nation and Métis communities who may have the following interests in the area of your project:

- an interest in the area of the project.

I am writing to you today in response to your immediately preceding e-mail of July 7th, 2015. I apologize for my delay in responding due in part to my desire to receive internal input / advice on your query from some of my MOECC Regional EA

Co-ordinator counterparts, in other MOECC offices across the Province, and a week of a absence from the office due to a recent summer vacation.

As advertised through the attached Notice of Commencement, the City of Sarnia initiated a Municipal Class EA to investigate options for shoreline protection along the southern waterfront of Sarnia Bay in Centennial Park (the Park). According to the Notice of Commencement, <u>the EA would also evaluate the removal of an existing boat ramp and installation of a new one closer to the existing marina</u>. The purpose of the study to develop a recommended plan to provide shoreline protection that is necessary for implementation of a clean soil cap at the Park in order to address historical contaminants in fill that was used during Park construction.

As noted in your preceding e-mail, under the Municipal Class EA process, there is a requirement to complete a Schedule 'C' level assessment when municipal plans: include the construction of new shore line works, such as off-shore breakwaters, shore-connected breakwaters, groynes and sea

walls (MEA, 2001, Page 1-19, No. 9). You have questioned this ministry as to whether the construction of a new boat launch within the project study area is subject to the Municipal Engineers Association Municipal Class EA, and if alternative designs of the boat launch are to be considered in addition to alternatives to protect the shoreline.

The MOECC acknowledges that boat launches are not specifically listed under Point No. 9 of Schedule C Wastewater Projects of the Municipal Engineers Association Municipal Class EA. However, that said, MOECC suggests that the shoreline works that are listed within Schedule C, are not the only shoreline works that could conceivably be part of a Schedule C Class EA. Reason being, Point No. 9's choice of terminology "such as" insinuates in and of itself that other shoreline works could conceivably be added and not limited just to those shoreline works specifically currently listed in Schedule C of the MEA Municipal Class EA.

Also, the City of Sarnia's Notice of Commencement specifically stated to the public, First Nations, and review agencies that this Class EA would in fact evaluate the removal of the existing boat ramp and installation of a new one closer to the existing marina. The general public, First Nations, and review agencies now have an expectation, based upon the project description outlined in the City's Notice of Commencement, that these aspects of the project will be fully reviewed and alternatives considered, culminating in a preferred alternative, including the right if need be to submit a Part II Order to the Minister of the Environment & Climate Change. For the City to do otherwise now, may invite criticism from one or more of the foregoing sources, and also could in and of itself result in Part Ii Order requests being submitted to the Minister for this project that might not otherwise have been submitted if the Class EA was completed as originally described in the Notice of Commencement.

In short, this Class EA should proceed as originally stated in the City's Notice of Commencement, providing the public, First Nations, and review agencies the opportunity to comment on the whole project including but not limited to both the removal of the existing boat ramp and the installation of a new one closer to the existing marina, and the right to submit Part II Order request(s) to the Minister of Environment & Climate Change should such be deemed necessary.

The City of Sarnia is currently completing a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) for shoreline protection along Sarnia Bay in the City if Sarnia, Ontario. Under the Municipal Class EA process, there is a requirement to complete a Schedule 'C' level assessment when municipal plans: *include the construction of new shore line works, such as off-shore breakwaters, shore-connected breakwaters, groynes and sea walls* (MEA, 2001, Page 1-19, No. 9).

Within the study area there is an existing boat launch to be removed and rebuilt at another location within the project study area. We would like to confirm whether construction of the boat launch is subject to a Municipal Class EA and if alternative designs of the boat launch are to be considered in addition to alternatives to protect the shoreline. 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
